

## NEW SBA GUIDANCE ALLOWS INCREASED PPP LOANS

The SBA released new guidance this week that allows an increase to the PPP loan amount if a self-employed individual or partner did not include themselves in their PPP calculations. If a partnership received a PPP loan that only included amounts necessary for payroll costs of the partnership's employees and other eligible operating expenses, but did not include any amount for partner compensation, the lender may electronically submit a request through SBA's E-Tran Servicing site to increase the PPP loan amount to include appropriate partner compensation, even if the loan has been fully disbursed, provided that the lender's first SBA Form 1502 report to SBA on the PPP loan has not been submitted.

## SBA FAQ #46: REGARDING GOOD-FAITH CERTIFICATION

When submitting a PPP application, all borrowers must certify in good faith that current economic uncertainty makes this loan request necessary to support the ongoing operations of the Applicant. SBA, in consultation with the Department of the Treasury, has determined that the following safe harbor will apply to SBA's review of PPP loans: Any borrower that, together with its affiliates, received PPP loans with an original principal amount of less than \$2 million will be deemed to have made the required certification concerning the necessity of the loan request in good faith.

# THE ROAD BACK FOR NJ

As part of New Jersey's Road Back, Governor Phil Murphy signed Executive Order No. 142, permitting the resumption of non-essential construction, curbside pickup at non-essential retail businesses, and car gatherings for the purpose of drive-through and drive-in events. The construction and non-essential retail provisions will take effect at 6:00 a.m. on Monday, May 18, while the car gatherings provision will take effect immediately.
